

# From the Principal

In a recent collection of attendance data for the school, we found that 62% of absences are unauthorised. Welcome back!

We hit the ground running this term. It has been so great hearing stories of the student's adventures during the school holiday period.

In the last newsletter I wrote about the data collected from the Parent and Student Survey. At the end of last term we conducted the Staff survey to compliment the Parent and Student Survey. While the results from the Parent and Student survey were positive the results of the staff survey were equally positive with significant improvements identified in most areas.

"Student behaviour is well manage", improved from 13% agree to 93% agree.

"The school is well maintained", resulted in a shift from 39% agree to 79% agree

"Student learning needs are being meet", improved from 35% disagree to 92% agree

"I would recommend this school to others", improved from 26% disagree to 100% agree

93% of staff say "students can talk to staff about their concerns"

93% of staff indicated "the staff at this school are good teachers" And finally

93% of staff indicated that "students feel safe at Boulder Primary School" All the survey data will be presented to the School Board for further discussion. As we seek continual improvement in the school's performance, staff will analyse, reflect and use these results to support the future planning and direction for Boulder Primary School.

During this year staff at Boulder Primary School have focussed on providing a safe, supportive and inclusive learning community. Therefore, student mental and emotional health is a significant priority for us. As you know most of this year we have focussed on TRIBES, Protective Behaviours and Zones of Regulation. To further build and develop our capacity to support our students, we have now commenced with our staff professional learning on Gatekeeper Suicide prevention program. This is an evidence based program based on best practice to equip our staff to be able to identify and better support our students if and when they may experience mental and/or emotional challenges. If you or your child require further information or support in this space please do not hesitate to contact us.

Unfortunately, over the last weekend Boulder Primary School has experienced a number of "break ins" which have, luckily, only resulted in broken windows. I am appealing to all members of our school community to "keep an eye" on our wonderful school out of hours. If you do observe any unusual or suspicious behaviour such as individuals on the school grounds at unusual hours, please contact School Watch on 1800 177 777. Any assistance which prevents further vandalism and damage is greatly appreciated.

We have a busy term ahead of us and I look forward to seeing everyone at the Assembly this Friday afternoon.



### Boulder Primary Colour Fun Day

We have our Colour Fun Day coming up on Friday 12 November 2021 at 1.35pm.

This event is run by our school's P & C and is a fun day for our children doing laps of the oval getting covered in colour. The powder used in this event is non-toxic, biodegradable and environmentally friendly consisting of 98% corn starch and 2% food colouring. 
