Proud History, From the Principal

Although it is week 4 term 1 we have kicked off 2022 with some amazing results. For the first three weeks we have achieved an attendance rate of 90%. This is considerably better when compared to the same time last year. Well done Boulder Primary School.

Mrs Williams has been assessing students for group allocation within the Initialit program this year identifying some significant improvements. These include:

- Increase in cohort average from 19% in 2021 to 34% in 2022
- Increase in (doubled) the number of students achieving 50% from 11% in 2021 to 23.5% in 2022
- Decreased the number of students below 10% from 21 in 2021 to 10 in 2022.
- An absolute first one student achieved 100%

I would like to thank the Boulder Primary School community for the support given in light of the recent implementation of some precautionary measures to reduce the possible impact of a Covid case at school. For us at Boulder PS:

- Staff are wearing masks, particularly when indoors and many staff continue to wear masks outside, and some masks have some really good designs and patterns.
- We ask parents when at school to please wear a mask
- All staff are double vaccinated with many also having their booster
- The staff at Boulder PS are forever vigilant to ensure the safety of all students.
- We are no longer holding assemblies, however Mr Fergusson is providing an alternative just go to our webpage to find out what this!

- We have zoned the school by classrooms, play areas and specialist staff
- As you are also aware parents/carers are not allowed in the classrooms
- We have handed out pamphlets which explain what we will do should we received news of a positive Covid case, this can also be found online.
- We have prepared work packages should the situation arise that we have to continue learning at home. Please note work packages will not be available if parents choose to keep their children at home.

We understand that parents and students may feel alarmed and cautious about the spread of Covid, however I encourage parents and careers to continue to keep a normal routine by sending students to school. Please remember, we operate with only the best interests of the students and we follow the advice of the Chief Health Officer. If you have any concerns a please do not hesitate to ask.

Next week we have two school development days (Monday 28th February and Tuesday 1st of March). During these two days staff will engage in professional learning in the area of Literacy, in particular writing. Staff will learn about the programs Talk4Writing, Seven Steps for Writing Success, review of our current spelling practices and word study, the Science of Reading (yes it involves science!) and revising the Grammar Punctuation and Editing Scope and Sequence.

Finally, I am happy to announce the arrival of 55 lap tops. These will be distributed across the school and support the implementation of technologies in classrooms. Students will have an opportunity to integrate this fantastic resources into their lessons. I am equally excited as these

Lap Tops will be replaced every 4 years ensuring the students of Boulder Primary School get the latest technology. I cannot wait to see the fantastic work the students produce with this piece of equipment.

To go with this, there are lots of research papers that outline the benefits of preparation for individuals and organisations. At Boulder PS, we take preparation seriously. With this in mind, we are proud to outline our preparedness for the improvement of our school for the next three years: the Boulder Primary School Business Plan 2022 - 2024.

This plan sets out an ambitious set of objectives. By the end of 2024, we want 80% of our students above the National Minimum Standard in NA-PLAN, and 60% of all students to be above the Decile 5 Median Score in Year 2 On-Entry. We also want our attendance rate to be 90%. Although these targets are ambitious, we believe they are achievable. Essential Worker:

According to state government, an essential worker is a person who performs work that is essential to the delivery of services including but not limited to:


- Essential health services
- Funeral or mortuary services
- Emergency services (SES, ambulance, fire fighters, paramedics etc.)
- Members involved in COVID response
- Government or local government services
- Media services
- Public and air transport
- Truck stops and roadhouses
- Retail (click-and-collect and delivery services)
- Teachers and essential school staff

Close Contact:

A person who has had face-to-face contact OR has shared a close space with someone diagnosed with COVID (while they were considered infectious) for any amount of time.

Community Transmission:

People who have tested positive for COVID where the source is unknown, presumably someone in the community






