From the Principal

Welcome back!

At Boulder Primary School, we seek to build the expertise of our staff. This has been recognised by staff being highly successful in gaining positions elsewhere. With the colder months ahead of us, could I encourage everyone to support the school uniform policy and purchase the school jumper. The P&C stock an amazing supply of shirts, shorts and jumpers, all part of an amazing school uniform. I know they are more than happy to help out.

Boulder Primary School prides itself on high standards and expectations. The staff at Boulder Primary School are resolute in their application of these. These standards and expectations apply to both behaviour and attendance. Our Behaviour Policy includes the requirements for students to maintain 'good standing' to participate in extracurricular school activities. At the commencement of each term all students are granted good standing. There are two significant ways a student can lose 'good standing'. The first is through displaying inappropriate behaviour which results in a suspension. The second is through attendance. We have set a target of 80% attendance to maintain 'good standing'. Should a student's attendance rate fall below 80% then they will not have 'good standing'. During the colder months attendance becomes that more difficult. It is therefore imperative that parents notify the school of the student's absence, as this is taken into consideration. This means that students without 'good standing' cannot participate in extracurricular activities. These include Excursions, Incursions, Camps, Sporting events. Should a student lose 'good standing' it will be reinstated at the conclusion of a 5-week period.

In saying all of this, there is always a clause that states the principal makes the final decision, in consultation with staff, if students can participate in these extracurricular activities.


From the Deputies
