There will be a competition for the class who has the most parent volunteers help.

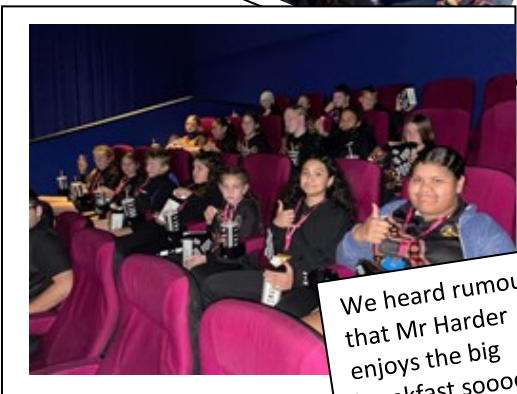
The P&C does need some help repairing a slushy machine and the canteen needs some empty Moccona coffee jars.

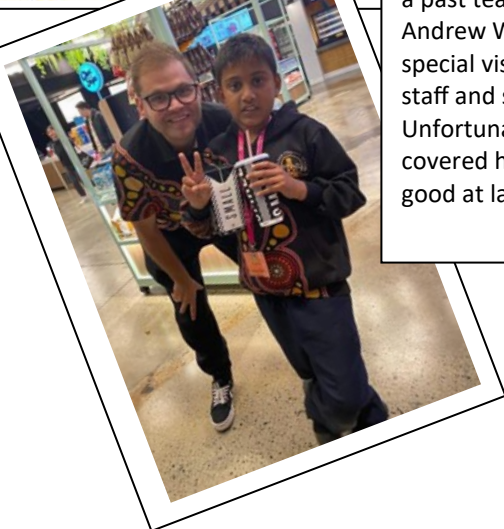
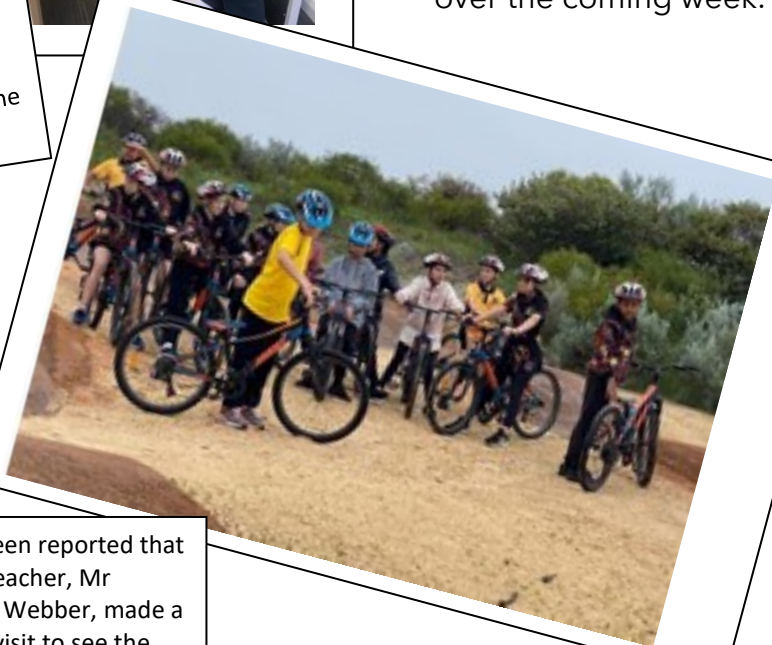
We heard rumours that Mr Harder enjoys the big breakfast soooo much there is nothing left for the students to eat!



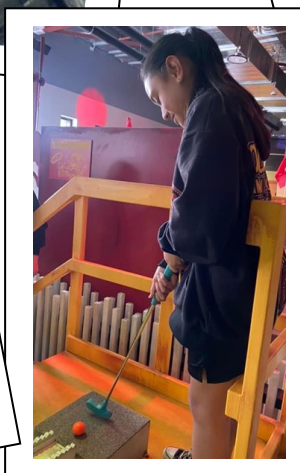

“Dreaming with Eyes Open”

Next week, the 20th-26th of August is Book Week. This year’s theme is “Dreaming with Eyes Open,” referring to Dreamtime or imagining through reading. Throughout Book Week students will have the opportunity to participate in a range of storytelling and reading experiences in class and during break times. Some things to look out for are:

RIBIT Reading Competition

Beginning on Saturday the 20th of August, students will be competing to be the top RIBIT class. Each night a student reads, they will earn a token for their class’s RIBIT tally. These will be checked before school each day and the winning class will be announced on Friday 26th of August. To give your child’s class the best chance to win, complete your RIBIT reader every night.

The Book Week Parade

The Book Week Parade will be held on Friday the 26th of August at 9.00am. Students will get the chance to parade around in their book character costumes and all families are invited to attend. Prizes will be won by the students from each year level with the greatest book character costumes.

Door Display Competition

Before the end of Book Week, each class will be working as a team to innovatively design and create a door display. Students will get to vote which door is their favourite on Friday the 26th of August before the winning class is announced. ECE Playground Design

We are pleased to show the first design for the new ECE Playground. With a nature play theme we hope this new playground will revitalise our current play ground. The new Early Childhood playground development has been designed to provide our students with opportunities to gain mastery over a range of gross and fine motor skills including coordination, dexterity, climbing, and balancing.

The design includes spaces such as a watercourse, rock formations, musical instruments, a mud kitchen, and varied ground surfaces promoting creativity and explorative play. Within the playground there are social spaces, such as a yarning circle, a giant tee-pee, play decks, cubbies and forts that will promote dramatic play and support students to develop social skills through play-based learning. We are so excited for this project to get underway, watch this space.
