At the fete, I had the pleasure of spending about 3 hours in the hall, talking to a lot of ex students. What is apparent is the long, long history the school has, and the fact that all who came expressed that Boulder held a special place in their heart. It should fill us with pride, that as custodians of the school, we are doing our best to maintain the high standard of the school. What also came out of the day was some ripping anecdotes. Here are some nuggets of history:

- Former Premier "Honest" John Tonkin was Dux of the school in the 1910s. Think about that the next time you cruise down Tonkin Highway. There is some conjecture about whether he deserved apparently a smarter but much less studious student's family claimed he should have got it.
- I spoke with one teacher who taught in 1974. He had 45 students in the Maths room. In the middle of the year, the teacher in Room 15 got sick. There was no relief around, so the Principal asked this teacher if he could take both classes 90 on the books!
- A teacher throwing a duster at a student was a common occurrence.
- A Mrs Ryan in the early 1970s was very highly spoken about.
- In the mid 70s it was common for teachers to send their student to the bank to cash their cheques. Students were also free to collect a leave pass and go to the fish and chip shop

Undoubtedly the showcase of the St Barbara's Festival, the Parade is a fun filled extravaganza for the whole family!


