   Social and Emotional Learning, and Professional Learning.
- The Positive Behaviours in School Matrix, which will be introduced in the coming months.
- And finally Professional Learning on the new Origo Math program.

Our priorities for 2023 remain the same as for 2022. These are; Early Intervention, Social Emotional Learning and Capacity Building. I am very happy to say that after some very pleasing results at the conclusion of 2022 we will continue to implement the following programs Intialit, Tribes, Zones of Regulation, Positive Behaviours in School (PBS), Behaviour Management Process and Numero.

This year I am also excited to announce we will be introducing a math program called Origo. I am hoping with another whole school approach this time for Math we will be able to provide and maintain the continuity of curriculum delivery and see an improvement in student performance.

Providing a time for Parents to hear from their childs teacher is very important. We have scheduled a Parent Night to be held on Thursday the 16th of February starting at 5:30pm. We did not hold this event last year due to the Covid pandemic. This session is invaluable for Parents and Carers as it provides an opportunity for teachers to discuss how they manage the class, routines, expectations and school policy.

# Proud History, From the Deputy Principal's

There is a saying about preparation that I have adopted and use regularly with the staff at Boulder Primary School. It goes "Perfect Preparation Prevents Poor Performance". It is called the 6 P's, but I have omitted one for appropriateness. We all know how much better our lives are when we prepare in advance. To go with this, there are lots of research papers that outline the benefits of preparation for individuals and organisations. At Boulder PS, we take preparation seriously. With this in mind, we are proud to outline our preparedness for the improvement of our school for the next three years: the Boulder Primary School Business Plan 2022 – 2024.

This plan sets out an ambitious set of objectives. By the end of 2024, we want 80% of our students above the National Minimum Standard in NAPLAN, and 60% of all students to be above the Decile 5 Median Score in Year 2 On-Entry. We also want our attendance rate to be 90%. Although these targets are ambitious, we believe they are achievable. The flow on effect is that we are enjoying the conditions to give your child the best possible education at Boulder Primary School.

Already, our Year 5 students achieved the 80% above National Minimum Standard in NAPLAN Spelling, and our attendance rate is currently 89%.

The Boulder Primary School 2023 Operational Plan outlines a detailed roadmap, aligning specific actions, timelines, budgets, and targets working towards achieving the objectives set out in the Boulder Primary School 2022 – 2024 Business Plan. It provides staff with a framework for day-to-day operations in the areas of Teaching and Learning, Learning Environment, Relationships, Leadership and Recourses.

With successful students at the center of everything we do and a priority area of "Early Intervention" identified in Boulder Primary School's strategic plan an operational decision to enhance Teaching and Learning and embed a targeted literacy program, InitiaLit, from Kindergarten to Year Two was made. InitiaLit is an evidence based whole class literacy providing our students with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers.

Another priority area identified in our Business Plan is "Social and Emotional Learning (SEL)". With this priority as a driver the Boulder Primary School Operation Plan outlines our SEL programs, Tribes, Zones of Regulation and Protective Behaviours and a SEL scope and Sequence for all staff to follow, building an inclusive, safe, and respectful Learning Environment.

"Building the capacity of staff" is also a priority area within our Business Plan. To enable the success of the programs implemented, the Operation Plan outlines a range of professional learning to support staff and build their capacity to implement programs with fidelity and deep commitment.

The Operational Plan is endorsed by the Boulder Primary School Board. The daily operations are reviewed, and recommendations guide future operations. If you have any questions or would like to chat about the Operational Plan, please come and see me.

# What is RIBIT?

RIBIT is our Home-Reading program, encouraging your child to read or be read to. You are never too old to be read to and there is no better way of preparing your child to succeed as a reader than reading aloud to or with them. Reading to your child stimulates imagination, improves their ability to focus on tasks, develops communication and listening skills, helps with comprehension and gives your child time to enjoy your company.

# How can we do it?

Each night, read to your child or ask your child to read to you.

Fill in the recording sheet by adding the date and title of what you read. Only one entry can be made each day.

You can read anything! Books are available for your child to check-out in class each day, and you can use these, school library books, books from your own bookshelf or any reading material your child is interested in to fill out your RIBIT Reader.

The more you read, the more you earn. Prizes and certificates are awarded for 50, 100 and 150 nights reading at assemblies.


