### Term 2, Week 8 2023

Many thanks to Mrs Healey, Mrs Thomas and the amazing students of Sandalwood for their entertaining and thoroughly delightful performance of Down by the Bay at the Assembly last Friday. Dressed in some amazing costumes the students sang about Cats in Hats, Goats on Boats, Frogs walking Dogs and Dragons pulling Wagons, lots of rhyming going on!!!

As you know NAPLAN was conducted earlier this year. However, this is not the only change for NAPLAN. While we anticipate parents and schools will receive individual results in July, this month the Federal Government has through the National School Reform Agreement, made some significant changes. This being a shift away from the use of Bands and the introduction of new proficiency standards. Subsequently student reports will look different, simplified to previous years by the removal of the ten bands and replacing these with the proposed proficiency levels. These are: Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs additional support. These benchmarks will be set against what is being quoted as "challenging but reasonable" standard of literacy and numeracy. No longer will there be a measurement against a "minimum standard". We hope to develop our understanding of this change, to attend a Professional Learning session later in August. These sessions we hope will help us with analysing and interpreting data using the Proficiency Standards. Student reports will continue to show the national average and range of achievement for the middle 60% of students. Last week we were very lucky to have a visit from a representative from central office to inspect a suitable room for a Science Upgrade. Coupled with the refurbishment of the Library focussing on STEM, the students at Boulder Primary School will have facilities second to none. The Science room will be a great addition to the school and allow us to increase student opportunity to participate and engage in the cross curricula priority STEM!

At the Assembly I announced the departure of Mrs Kaitlen Azzam. After 7 years teaching Boulder Primary School her family has decided to return to Perth. Kaitlen has also secured a contract at Roleystone Community High School and we wish her every success at her new school. On behalf of the staff, students, parents and Boulder Primary School community I would like to express our sincere thanks to Kaitlen for her time with us and wish her and her family every success for the future.

#### **Early Childhood Playground News**

We are fast approaching the start date for Nature Playgrounds to commence the Early Childhood Nature Playground. They plan on starting the project July 10<sup>th</sup>, which will be the second week of the upcoming school holidays and their estimated completion date is August 26<sup>th</sup>, which is Friday Week 6, Term 3. To help us clear the area in preparation for the transformation, we had a group of volunteers from BHP come in to remove the PVC borders from around the sand/play areas. We are thankful for their support. We are planning a busy bee day on Saturday the 24<sup>th of</sup> June to relocate the lovely grass that is in the early childhood area. If you are available and are willing to help, please let me know. The playground equipment, sheds, shade sales and structures in the area are up for tender, if you are interested in purchasing any of these structures, please see Nicole Softly MCS.

While the playground is under construction there will be some impact on the early childhood students. We are hoping to place temporary fencing across each of the classroom verandahs to allow students to remain in their current classrooms. During the construction period all Kindy and Pre-Primary students will join our Year 1/2's students in the junior playground during recess and lunch, with their teachers supervising. Hi Everyone,

In Term 3 I will be running a Grief and Loss Program for children.

There will be a letter going home with a consent form attached which you can fill out and return to the front office if you would like your child or children to do the program.

The program is run in school time and runs for 5 weeks. To be eligible your child needs to be in Years 3 - 6 and to have experienced the loss of a person who is close to them.

This loss needs to have happened at least 6 months before they do the program.

I have been running this program for several years now and have seen the children benefit emotionally and socially as they make new friends who have been through the same thing.
