Last week the staff of Boulder Primary School attended a School Development Day at the Boulder Lawn Bowls Club. As Boulder Primary School continues to seek ongoing improvement this day was used so staff could review both the school and student performance in 5 areas. These areas being Teaching and Learning, Learning Environment, Resources, Relationships and Leadership. Staff also analysed data from assessments such as NAPLAN, On Entry and Surveys. Most importantly after analysing and dissecting the data staff have made recommendations for the 2024 Operational Plan to improve student outcomes and school performance.

Also, last week, the staff and members of the school board and P&C met with the Director of School Review and a Peer Colleague to discuss the school's effectiveness over the past three years. I would like to recognise the amazing efforts and contributions of the staff at Boulder Primary School and also Janet Hill, Warren Stewart, Margaretta Hansen, Ellen McCleer, Jess Dann, Medina Kocian and Kat Donovan for giving their time to meet with the reviewers. While the reviewers confirmed the staff judgements of our effectiveness a report will be presented at the next School Board meeting. This report will also be available online for those who wish to read the commendations and recommendations from the reviewers.

As we bring 2023 to a close, staff are now busy preparing for 2024. One task staff take seriously in preparing for next year is the creation of class lists for 2024. Staff consider many complexities when developing a class list. Staff pay attention to three areas - social, behavioural and academics. If parents would like to make a request based on these three areas, for the placement of their child in 2024 please submit your request in writing and deliver your letter to the front office by Friday the 1st of December 2023. Staff will then consider and review these requests. A request is not a guarantee of a student's placement for 2024.

I would like to announce and congratulate Mr Ashley Ferguson on his recent appointment to the position of Principal at Kalgoorlie Primary School. Ash has been a dedicated and committed servant of Boulder Primary School over the last seven years. He has shown not only the leadership potential but importantly the leadership attributes to successfully lead his own school. We know he will do an amazing job at Kalgoorlie Primary School, and we wish him every success.

Finally I would like to also recognise the efforts of Ms Skinner and 4 amazing students Quincy Sheck, Lucas McMeeken, Alexandra McMeeken and Ella Hunter who travelled to Perth to compete in the state Numero challenge. Well done everyone! I have included a report from Quincy Sheck outlining his recount of the event. It appears the travel and food were a highlight of his time away.


