Restorative Approaches

At Boulder Primary School our key focus on developing students' Social and Emotional Wellbeing has been evident with vast improvements to our learning environment. The development of our student's self-awareness, self-control and interpersonal skills has enabled a learning environment where students can engage in learning and our teachers can teach with minimal disruption. One of our Social and Emotional Learning pillars is Restorative Approaches. The embedment of this pillar encourages behaviour that is supportive and respectful, putting onus on individuals to be truly accountable for their behaviour and repair any harm caused to others as a result of their actions.

Furthermore, Restorative Approaches focuses on building, maintaining and restoring positive relationships, particularly when incidents that involve interpersonal conflict or wrongdoing occur. Specifically, at Boulder Primary School, Restorative Approaches is embedded in our whole-school Behaviour Management process. If students receive a detention due to their behaviour, they engage in a restorative conversation with a member of staff. This conversation aims to reflect on any harm caused, who it has impacted and how, as well as conversing about the next steps in restoring positive relationships . Recently, all staff at Boulder Primary School undertook professional learning in Restorative Approaches.

Prioritising relationships across our school community and upskilling our staff to support implementation will hopefully continue to reduce the frequency of behaviour incidents to occurring and overall improve school culture that enables the development of successful students.

Early Arrivals

As Term Three begins, parents and carers are reminded that school commences at 8:30am, with classroom doors opening at this time. At Boulder Primary School, we encourage our students to arrive on time allowing them to participate in our daily Literacy Block and not miss out on crucial learning time.

For students arriving early, our school gates open at 8:00am with the hall open for supervised activities such as Numero, chess, reading and Tribes energisers. We ask that you do not arrive prior to this as there will be no supervision and students cannot enter school grounds until 8:00am, as this raises supervision concerns. If students are supervised by a parent or carer prior to 8:30am we ask that students, please remain seated as they are not permitted on the playground and should not be running around in the undercover areas and basketball courts. For those students not supervised by a parent, we ask that they make their way to the hall where they will be collected by their classroom teacher.


Boulder Dental Clinic




